Big News (in a Tiny Package)

In our last letter, Alecia shared her heart for orphans and God's plan for us to become a foster/adoptive family. This time it is my privilege to tell you that God has confirmed his calling again, and given us charge of not one, but two beautiful baby girls. Many of you have heard, but on Friday, September 17, a DHS resource worker called to ask if we could take ten-day-old twins, the first of which would be released from the hospital that evening. Since our final paperwork had only just been completed, we didn't expect to receive a call for a placement for at least several weeks. The resource worker told Alecia that two sets of twins (that's right, four babies!) were placed in state custody that morning. She was searching for families that could take the children, and decided to look at the file that had just been placed on her desk. She immedi-



ately realized that our family was exactly what she was looking for. "Could we bring you one of the twins tonight?"

What has followed since is what every parent of newborn children is familiar with: rows of bottles, stacks of diapers, and frequently interrupted sleep. Of course, when we picked up the second bundle of joy, it all doubled... and sleep went out the window!

A Few Itty Bitty Details...

As foster parents, we are expected to protect both the children in our care and information regarding their family and situation. Therefore, we won't divulge too many details, but here is what we can share:

The "Muffin Twins," as they are known on Facebook, were born a little premature, at approximately 34 weeks. The twins had a condition known as twin to twin transfusion, which means one twin got all the "groceries," leaving the other with a few leftovers. So their birth weights were very different: one was 4lbs. 3oz.; the other 2lbs 11oz. That is why we received Mini Muffin on September 17, but didn't get Micro Muffin until October 6. Micro was just too small to be released from the hospital! God's hand was always on them, as they are both completely healthy, and do their best to keep our arms full!

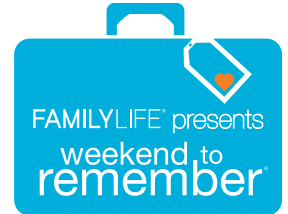
